A MEDLEY OF CLINICAL AND PRACTICAL PHARMACOLOGY



This seven hour presentation will be divided into two sections.

The morning session provides the nuts and bolts of practical pharmacology useful in the dental office. Using commonly prescribed drugs as a starting point, the presentation explores the control of post-operative

dental pain, the antibiotic(s) of choice for oro-facial infections, the antibiotic prophylaxis guidelines for the cardiac and/or orthopedic prosthesis patient, current information on bisphosphonate induced osteonecrosis as well as potentially harmful drug interactions.

The afternoon session will provide a snapshot of legal and illegal drug abuse. This part of the program will explore the nature of addiction, dental management of patients who are in recovery, the current state of the opioid epidemic, more popular drugs of abuse among adults and adolescents, signs and symptoms of their abuse, and the impact of substance abuse on your practice, your family and you.

This section will include the current state regulations regarding CRISP and how to enroll. And lastly, this course will include new and updated regulations to satisfy the two hour State Board of Dental Examiners required course on Proper Pharmacologic Prescribing and Disposal.

This lively, entertaining, and informative presentation lecture should be attended by all dentists, spouses, dental hygienists and dental team members.
