## Pharmaceutical and Street Drug Abuse and Their Impact on You, Your Family, and Your Dental Practice



This workshop will provide a snapshot of legal and illegal drug abuse. The program will explore the nature of addiction, dental management of patients who are in recovery or actively using, the current state of the opioid epidemic, more popular drugs of abuse among adults

and adolescents, signs and symptoms of their abuse, and the impact of substance abuse on your practice, your family and you. One section of the presentation will provide a snapshot of marijuana and the issues surrounding its legalization/medicalization. Inevitably, some of these marijuana users will be treated by the dentist or hygienist. What is it? How is it used? Does it have any medicinal use? Are there any drug interactions between marijuana and dental drugs? This lecture will also include the current state regulations regarding CRISP and how to enroll. And, lastly, this course will include new and updated regulations to satisfy the two hour State Board of Dental Examiners required course on Proper Pharmacologic Prescribing and Disposal.
